#### October 5

Scriptures to read and meditate on: Lam 1:1-6; Ps 137; 2 Tim 1:1-14; Luke 17:5-10

#### **Call To Worship**

Scriptures to read and meditate on: Jer 29:1, 4-7; Ps 66:1-12; 2 Tim 2:8-15; Luke 17:11-19

#### **Call To Worship**

Come, all who are weary, all who are broken, all who long to be made whole. We come, for Jesus meets us on the way. Lift up your voices in thanksgiving, for Christ has healed us and made us new. With grateful hearts we return to give Him praise! We worship God with joy and thanksgiving!

#### **Prayer of Confession**

Scriptures to read and meditate on: Jer 31:27-34; Ps 119:97-104; 2 Tim 3:14-4:5; Luke 18:1-8

#### **Call To Worship**

Come, beloved of God, lift up your hearts. We lift them to the One who hears our cries day and night. God is our righteous Judge, patient and merciful. We come, not losing heart, but trusting in His faithfulness. We come to worship the Lord our God, who is holy and just!

#### **Prayer of Confession**

#### October 26

Scriptures to read and meditate on: Joel 2:23-32; Ps 65; 2 Tim 4:6-8, 16-18; Luke 18:9-14

#### **Call To Worship**

Come and worship, not trusting in your own goodness, but in God's mercy. For Jesus told a parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous. We are not here to exalt ourselves or to condemn others. We come as Pharisee and tax collector, saints and sinners, to seek God's mercy and grace. God meets us here with both truth and love. Let us worship the God who loves both Pharisee and tax collector and calls us to new life. Let us sing of God's marvelous and wonderful love!

#### **Prayer of Confession**

Holy and merciful God, We confess that we are quick to judge others and slow to see our own need. We fall into the trap of saying, "Thank you, God, that I am not like them." We live as if good works could save us, or as if sin does not matter. Forgive us when we exalt ourselves, when we measure others, when we choose truth without grace or grace without truth. Have mercy on us, O Lord. Like the tax collector we pray, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner."

#### **Prayer of Thanksgiving**

Merciful God, we thank You that You do not measure us by our deeds but by Your grace. We thank You that all we have and all we are comes from Your mercy. We offer these gifts and our lives, not to earn Your favor, but in gratitude for Your unending grace. May they be used to proclaim Your love and to serve Your kingdom, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

# **Encouragement for Fall**



**Fall** – to lose the old, to have its proper place. This is just part of the many definitions of what the dictionary says "fall" is. What is crazy is that the dictionary is talking about fall like 'I fell down', not fall like 'the season' and yet how appropriate the definition is.

There is lots to love about Fall!! The color change, the weather change, the smell change.....its about change. But to change means that something must go.

Just look out of your window, you can see Fall happening all around. Leaves are falling; what was once a tree deep in rich green, then a tree with vibrant shades of red and orange, now is soon becoming a tree that will be empty. Nothing left but the branches. Perhaps our human side finds that sad and we wish the color stayed, we think the only thing that makes the tree beautiful is the colorful leaves ...why does it have to be so bare but that's a sign of what is to come.

But for every beginning there is an end and for every ending there is a new beginning. What is amazing is that those trees still stand. Those branches still reach out and upward. Not like the plants in the front yards of our neighbors houses that have to be cut back and will re-grow from their roots next spring. Those trees still stand. There is beauty in the strength of those branches.

This is such a picture of what Jesus does in our lives. We go through all kinds of seasons. Some are seasons of hard times, some loneliness, seasons of loss or other things such as financial hardships. And those seasons change us. We have seasons that are bright and beautiful and rich in life. Then we have seasons that He allows things in our life to enter so that we don't remain the same. But through all those seasons He is telling us let go and let Me. Let go and let me show you what I can do. Let go and let me show you what I can teach you... There is strength in your branches with Me. We have to let go grow a new perspective.

Is 43: 18-19 "Remember not the former things, nor consider the things of old. Behold I am doing a new thing: now it springs forth, do not perceive it? It will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the dessert."

The weight is too heavy for you to carry and still look up. We cannot continue in our walk with Jesus and never let go. We must go through these seasons so that we continue to learn to surrender our control and in the process we desire to be more like Him, to trust Him more, to fall in love with Him more. He did not create us to still look the same this season as the next season. The Bible is clear on that.

I Corinthians 13: 11 "When I was a child, I used to speak like a child, think like a child, reason like a child: when I became a man, I did away with childish things."

Total surrender is hard. But that is because total surrender means giving up control of our hearts, our souls and our minds. When we control our heart, our heart begins to lose heart for the things of Jesus. When we control the depths of our souls we control the wounds and the spaces that are not yet His. And when we control our minds, we allow fear, anxiety, shame to invade and soon we believe what we are thinking instead of resting on what our Father says is true.

Luke 10: 27 Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind..."

We cannot hold on to parts of us and say we have surrendered. God wants all of us. God wants us to let go of the things that are holding us. When we do and those things fall... and new life comes from it. Change happens in us and through us. He reminds us that He is still there standing strong and He still holding us up, much like the tree and the branches. He says let go of it and I will hold you.

**Isaiah 41: 10** "Fear not, for I am with you, be not dismayed, for I am your God: I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous hand."

God knows the depths of your world. He knows the depths of your hurt, the depths of your fear, the depths of your insecurities, the depths of your loss but He promises if you let it go He will bring new life and you will be a vessel ready to be used by your creator.

I Peter 5: 6, 10 "Humble yourselves, therefore, under the mighty hand of God so that in proper time he may exalt you, casting all your anxieties on Him, because He cares for you ...and the God of all grace, who has called you to His eternal glory in Christ will Himself restore, confirm, strengthen and establish you."

We cannot accept the gift of salvation and then do it our way with our limits, holding on to the parts of our life we don't want to let go. Our relationship with Jesus is worth more than just a part of us...let go and let God! And remember letting go is much like the leaves that will fall this autumn....it is a sign of what is to come. Surrender means to give up oneself into the power of another. So today ...whatever part your still holding on to .... surrender it...and allow God to bring newness of life.

January - cereal and instant oatmeal cups
February - peanut butter and jelly jars
March - canned milk and dry milk powder
April - Mac n Cheese
May - canned meats and fish
June - canned fruit, fruit snacks and fruit cups
July - canned or boxed soup and soup cups
August - cereal bars / granola bars
September - peanut butter
October - canned pasta and pasta cups
November - anything thanksgiving
December - paper goods and personal hygiene items

In addition to the above list we are collecting Kleenex, Lysol wipes and hand sanitizer for the teachers and kids at AR Ware Elementary.

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The following list was shared by a food bank volunteer.

There are some excellent suggestions if you are ever unsure what to give, or if you see these items on sale. Fresh items should be taken directly to the food pantry.

- 1. Everyone donates Kraft Mac & Cheese in the box, but it needs milk & butter which is hard to get from food banks.
- 2. Boxed Milk is a treasure. Kids need it for cereal, which they get a lot of.
- 3. Everyone donates pasta sauce & spaghetti noodles.
- 4. Canned Foods should be Pop Tops OR donate Can Openers.
- 5. Oil is a luxury needed for Rice a Roni which they get a lot of.
- 6. Spices, Salt & Pepper are a real gift.
- 7. Tea bags & Coffee are caring gifts.
- 8. Sugar & Flour are treats.
- 9. Important are fresh produce donated by farmers & grocery stores.
- 10. Seeds are great in spring & summer because growing can be easy for some.

- 11. Rarely is there fresh meat.
- 12. Tuna & Crackers make a good lunch.
- 13. Hamburger Helper goes nowhere without ground beef.
- 14. They get lots of peanut butter and jelly but NEED sandwich bread.
- 15. Butter or Margarine are good.
- 16. Eggs are a commodity!
- 17. Cake mix & Frosting makes it possible to make a child's birthday cake.
- 18. Dishwashing Detergent is very expensive & is always appreciated.
