Cans and Kits 4 Conference

The Virginia Conference has invited every church to participate in this year's Annual Conference mission project called "Community Cans & Kits." You may recall the "Kits for Conference" and "Cans 4 Conference" initiatives in the past when UMCOR kits and canned food were collected and delivered to Annual Conference. This year Annual Conference will be held virtually, and there are several options for helping. Maybe you would like to pick one or a Sunday School class would like to pick one option for focus. We are encouraged to have a "Fill the Church with Canned Goods Sunday" the first week of June. So let's see how much we can gather by June 6 and we'll ask those offerings to be blessed before they are distributed. The local ministries to be served are: Valley Mission, Blue Ridge Area Food Bank, Augusta County Schools, Marquis Memorial Food Pantry

Needs for food pantries: canned goods...especially soups, vegetables, canned pastas, (but no more green beans please), etc. There is an immediate need for: peanut butter, crackers, pop top soups, Pop tarts, Vienna sausages. There is an immediate need for non-food items: soap, laundry detergent, dish detergent, bathroom tissue, paper towels, shaving cream, and our UMCOR hygiene kits.

While hygiene kits, flood buckets, school kits are always in demand, Conference cannot accept kits this year. He says they want to concentrate on hygiene kits for local distribution, as well as the canned goods and non-food items. Listed below is the Hygiene Kit Material list from the UMCOR site. If you choose to put these kits together, bring them to church. We'll get them delivered

Hygiene Kit Materials

- **One hand towel (15 x 25 –17 x 27 inches)**
No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- **One washcloth**
No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- **One comb**
Must be sturdy with at least 6 inches of teeth
No pocket combs or picks
Rattail and combs without handles are acceptable but must have at least 6 inches of teeth
- **One toenail or fingernail clipper**
No emery boards or metal nail files
- **Bath-size soap (3 oz. bar or larger)**
No Ivory or Jergen's soap
Do not remove from packaging
- **One adult toothbrush**
Do not remove from packaging
Personal advertising not acceptable
- **10 adhesive bandages (¾ by 3 inches)**
Common household bandages acceptable
- **One one-gallon size re-sealable bag**

Assembly Instructions

- Lay hand towel flat on a table.
- Lay the washcloth in the center of the hand towel.
- Place all remaining items on top of the washcloth (except the plastic bag).
- Fold the sides of the hand towel to cover the items.
- Grasp the bundle tightly and roll over the remainder of the towel.
- Place the tightly rolled bundle in the plastic bag, remove air, and seal.

Important Notes

- All items must be new.
 - Do not wash any of the items as they will no longer be considered new.
 - Do not include any personal notes, money or additional materials in the kits.
- Contents of kits or the containers of kits should not be imprinted with cartoon characters, advertisements, religious, patriotic, military or camouflage symbols

Devotion Finds A Way

Isn't it frustrating when you lose things? Especially when it is important things and you are late, such as glasses or car keys. Even though we may be the last one to have seen and touched the item, we always think someone else moved the item.

We don't like losing things – glasses, keys, pens, phone, but we especially should hate losing the anointing and keen awareness of God. It should make us very uncomfortable when the fire goes out or the sensitivity to Holy Spirit wanes. What most of us discover is that this happens gradually, without us consciously realizing it. We who have within us the well of salvation, the river of life, sometimes fail to drink from it.

Seeking and loving God with all our hearts, souls, minds and strength is often lost in the melee of doing life. Priorities sometimes need to be re-prioritized. We “court” many things in life: success, advancement, fame, other people, glory, money, favor, and a myriad of other goals we humans strive to reach. Gordon Dahl aptly said, “Many Americans tend to worship their work, to work at their play, and to play at their worship.”

This is so true. We often forget to drink from the fountain filling our spirits. Growing thirsty, we take another drink. God's desire, however, is that we continuously drink from the fountain, live in His river, and abide in His wrap around presence.

Quoting A.W. Tozer: “There are occasions when for hours I lay prostrate before God without saying a word of prayer or a word of praise – I just gaze on Him and worship. Sometimes no words are needed. We just enjoy one another's company.”

“Alvin Straight, age 73, lived in Laurens, Iowa. His estranged brother, Lyle, age 80, lived 240 miles away in Blue River, Wisconsin. According to the Associated Press, Alvin's brother had suffered a stroke, and Alvin wanted to see him and make amends, He had a transportation problem, however. He didn't have a driver's license because his legs and eyesight were bad, and he apparently had an aversion to taking a plane, train, or bus. But Alvin didn't let that stop him. In 1994 he hitched a trailer to his 1966 John Deere tractor lawn mower, climbed aboard, and drove it – 5 mph – all the way to Blue River, Wisconsin. “Devotion finds a way.”

It is easy to see how the last 14 months could have affected your ability to enjoy the pleasure of the Father's company. But the Holy Spirit is calling us to drink from His fountain, and to draw near to Him. In Israel's history, Yahweh typically encouraged the Israelites to draw near to Him before He performed great redemptive acts. As preparation for the coming revival, He is saying the same to us - “Draw near to Me.” Hebrews 7:19, a better hope is introduced, (Jesus) by which we draw near to God.

Let's Pray together:

Father, it is our desire to draw near to You, we ask You to draw near to us. And we are confident You will. Prepare us for the next season of Holy Spirit outpouring. Change our wine skins. Make them fresh and pliable. Help us to refocus and become undistracted by life and it's challenges.

Where we have lost our cutting edge, please re-sharpen it. Where we have lost our hunger, please help us find it. Where we have lost our commitment, please help us find repentance. Our desire is to be rightly positioned with You so You can do the wondrous things You desire to do in our lives, our city, our nation and the world. In Christ's name we ask this, Amen.
